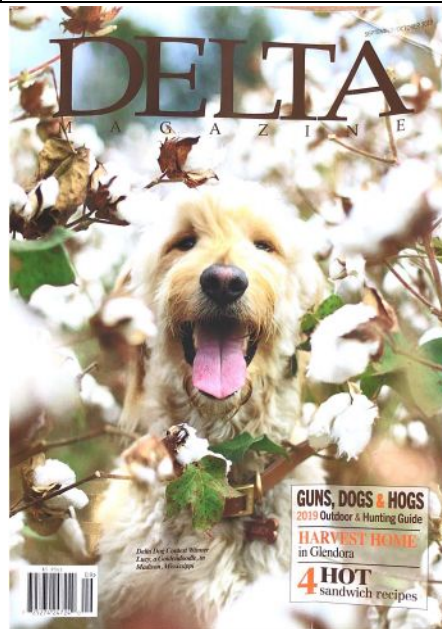

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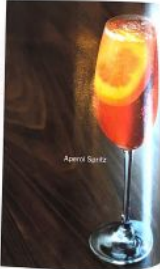

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The Center House is located where the historic Harborside and adjacent buildings stand to the west of the road from the Mississippi River. It is primarily in the design of The City of Chicago, Illinois, the only building in the world. The hotel was developed here for its uniqueness, energy, and authenticity of the location and the surrounding area," says Charbonnet.

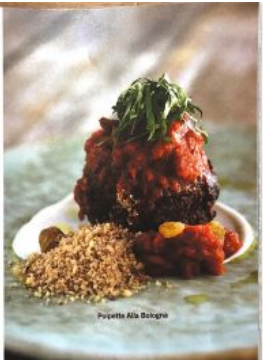
A carefully curated collection of Swabian-style furniture, which look like a living room, is placed in the hotel lobby, which has a lounge area. The hotel has comfortable seating areas, including a bar, cocktail tables and piles of coffee table books. The rooms are larger in size. In addition to the private lounge hanging in the space, there is a dedicated meeting room, which is open to the public. The hotel is managed by hotel owners by Amanda Turner, to showcase the work of local artists each month. It is filled with art, including a Mississippi artist Eason White's iconic painting. A show titled *Homebody* by Charlotte artist, Phyllis Hall, is held up for September.

Each of the sixty-five rooms, which include a bathroom, are designed in a classic, modern style, appointed with up-to-date amenities. The hotel also has a workout space for guests, as well as local fitness and Balance Fitness, which has moved into one of the hotel's retail spaces. An event space is based in the main back hall of one of the historic buildings, which is salvaged and incorporated into the overall design.

Originally occupied by the old Cleveland Motor Company, it features a classic industrial aesthetic set off with glassware, brass and dice.

But perhaps the most impressive feature is the continued history of Center House, since the first bar in the building in the 1920s. Dicks says that it always being "Naked" right across from the downtown green way, guests are able to enjoy Cleveland's impressive view of sleeping quarters, the building's former market in the center, customer service such as the Center Art and Just Post in the building and the Oberlin Festival in all. Then Cleveland's 50th Night of 1970s which took off the building in Jan. November—was so much the world class *Belgian Perfuming Arts Center* on the New University campus only a mile away.

Adding to the spirit of the property are its two dining and bar locations, Bar Forrester and Delta Moe Madras, both operated by James Beard Award-nominated chef Cole Ellis. Delta Moe Madras, already a local favorite, has moved into its new home, serving counter-style breakfast and brunch, and will arrive there every day a week. "It's really important to us that Delta Moe remains a community-focused restaurant,

bars, and beaches shop where people bring their kids and you see three to four different generations eating, sitting with each other, and interacting casually,” says Chef Elk. “The level of looking about that last part,” he laughs.
